Area 78 – Panel 76 Delegate’s Corner February 2026

My name is Dave S., and I am a real alcoholic as described in the Big Book.

In the last few weeks there has been a whirlwind of activity in general service for Area 78 and all the other 93 Areas in the Canada/US structure.

The General Service Board distributed the list of the final Agenda items that will come to the floor of the General Service Conference in New York for the 135 voting members of the General Service Conference. These items will be reviewed, discussed and considered in respective committees and as a Conference as a whole.

Each of the 93 Areas have autonomy on how they distribute this information and collect the group conscious of their area. This will guide the Area Delegate when they attend and have a vote on the myriads of items that could affect Alcoholics Anonymous as a whole in both the present and the future.

Area 78’s Pre Conference Assembly is coming up quickly as follows:

March 27-29, 2026 – Best Western Premier Calgary Plaza Hotel – 1316 33 Street NE, Calgary AB

You will find information at area78.org if you need an agenda or would like to book a hotel room. All background information and the 69 final agenda items are also on the area 78 website under private downloads. Reach out to your District Committee Member (DCM) for access.

The Pre-Conference Assembly in Calgary will also be live-streamed where members will be able to view/listen. This event will not be “interactive.” Virtual log-in information is on area78.org. I look forward to meeting many of you there.

This is where I believe in the importance of having a group representative (GSR) who carries the group conscience through the assemblies to the Delegate, to help us to go to New York to guide the movement of Alcoholics Anonymous for today and the future.

If your group does not have a GSR, I encourage you to have a representative show up at our Pre-Conference Assembly in Calgary. You are linking your home group with the whole of AA right out of the GSR pamphlet (P-19).

Any member can attend and participate by sitting in on a committee. You can have a voice for your group by partaking in the discussions that shape our future. And – we will try to have a little fun while we are doing it – Rule 62!

This past week I was tasked with forwarding to the General Service Conference my 2-minute presentation of the highlights of Area 78. In particular, I was pleased to share the following information:

Area 78 covers over 2,000,000 square kilometers — close to 1,000,000 square miles. To put that in perspective, according to my GPS, driving from our southernmost AA meeting in Milk River, Alberta, to our northernmost meeting in Inuvik, Northwest Territories, would take 44 straight hours. That’s about three hours longer than driving from New York City to Los Angeles.

It can be a challenge to be the largest of the 93 Areas, yet we continue to make strides in making connections. Every member is important – and every member is doing their best to carry the message to the still-suffering alcoholic. Our disease isolates us – our Third Legacy of Service connects us! From sponsorship to every other service position there is – every act of service in Alcoholics Anonymous keeps this movement trudging the road of happy destiny (being on purpose).

The Third Legacy is about self-sacrifice – I want to thank you in advance for spending your valuable time ensuring that our Fellowship continues to thrive.

We ask especially for freedom from self-will and are careful to make no request for ourselves only. We may ask for ourselves, however, if others will be helped. We are careful never to pray for our own selfish ends. Many of us have wasted a lot of time doing that and it doesn't work. You can easily see why.

As we go through the day we pause, when agitated or doubtful, and ask for the right thought or action. We constantly remind ourselves we are no longer running the show, humbly saying to ourselves many times each day "Thy will be done."

Tradition Three

“Our membership ought to include all who suffer alcoholism. Hence we may refuse none who wish to recover.

Nor ought A.A. membership ever depend upon money or conformity.

Any two or three alcoholics gathered together for sobriety may call themselves an A.A. group, provided that, as a group, they have no other affiliation.”

The third tradition is a sweeping statement indeed; it takes in a lot of territory. Some people might think it too idealistic to be practical. **It tells every alcoholic in the world that he may become, and remain, a member of Alcoholics Anonymous so long as he says so.** In short, Alcoholics Anonymous has no membership rule.


Why is this so? Our answer is simple and practical. Even in self protection, we do not wish to erect the slightest barrier between ourselves and the brother alcoholic who still suffers. We know that society has been demanding that he conform to its laws and conventions. But the essence of his alcoholic malady is the fact that he has been unable or unwilling to conform either to the laws of man or God. If he is anything, the sick alcoholic is a rebellious nonconformist. **How well we understand that; every member of Alcoholics Anonymous was once a rebel himself. Hence we cannot offer to meet him at any half-way mark. We must enter the dark cave where he is and show him that we understand. We realize that he is altogether too weak and confused to jump hurdles. If we raise obstacles, he might stay away and perish.** He might be denied his priceless opportunity.

So when he asks, “Are there any conditions?” we joyfully reply, “No, not a one.” When skeptically he comes back saying, “But certainly there must be things that I have to do and believe,” we quickly answer, “In Alcoholics Anonymous there are no musts.” Cynically, perhaps, he then inquires, “What is this all going to cost me?” We are able to laugh and say, “Nothing at all, there are no fees and dues.” Thus, in a brief hour, is our friend disarmed of his suspicion and rebellion. His eyes begin to open on a new world of friendship and understanding. Bankrupt idealist that he has been, his ideal is no longer a dream. After years of lonely search it now stands revealed. The

reality of Alcoholics Anonymous bursts upon him. For Alcoholics Anonymous is saying, “We have something priceless to give, if only you will receive.” That is all. But to our new friend, it is everything. Without more ado, he becomes one of us.

Our membership tradition does contain, however, one vitally important qualification. That qualification relates to the use of our name, Alcoholics Anonymous. **We believe that any two or three alcoholics gathered together for sobriety may call themselves an A.A. group provided that, as a group, they have no other affiliation.** Here our purpose is clear and unequivocal. **For obvious reasons we wish the name Alcoholics Anonymous to be used only in connection with straight A.A. activities.** One can think of no A.A. member who would like, for example, to see the formation of “dry” A.A. groups, “wet” A.A. groups, Republican A.A. groups, Communist A.A. groups. Few, if any, would wish our groups to be designated by religious denominations. **We cannot lend the A.A. name, even indirectly to other activities, however worthy. If we do so we shall become hopelessly compromised and divided.** We think that A.A. should offer its experience to the whole world for whatever use can be made of it. **But not its name. Nothing could be more certain.**

Let us of A.A. therefore resolve that we shall always be inclusive, and never exclusive, offering all we have to all men save our title. May all barriers be thus leveled, may our unity thus be preserved. And may God grant us a long life –and a useful one!


