Delegate's Corner – September 2026 – Area 78

Hello to all my fellow Area 78 AA members as well as members outside of our Area and any friends of AA who might read this newsletter. My name is Dave S and I am an alcoholic. I truly hope that you have had a great summer. I am TRULY privileged to serve as your Panel 76 Delegate.

We are ramping up for our Area 78 Business Assembly in Edmonton September 25-26-27, 2026. All pertinent information including an entire agenda, resumes for our Area nominee election for Canada Trustee at Large and all the motions that will be dealt with up to this point are on the Area 78 website under private downloads. All this information has been emailed out to your District Committee Members (DCMs) should you want to print them out for your own reference on the Saturday of the Assembly.

This is the process that Bill and Bob talked about when handing over the ownership of Alcoholics Anonymous to the fellowship.: The members and the groups of AA. This is where YOUR group has a vote on any policy and procedure changes in Area 78 and motions forwarded to the General Service Board as a proposed agenda item.

It can be a little grueling, but if you love Alcoholics Anonymous this is truly exciting and important work. When the motions are being discussed, any member can get up to the mic and speak. Once the voting has taken place, the minority voice can get up and speak and change the whole room – I have seen it happen.

My hope is that we see as many GSRs present in the room as possible, speaking and voting for their groups.

GSO staff member Nick S said, “Service isn’t supposed to be convenient” – but it also says in our Big Book that we are not a glum lot! Your voice and your vote matters. We are very capable people when given trust and love.

For the first time in many years there will be no banquet at this assembly. This had to do with rising costs which put the banquet tickets out of reach for many members. Please consider this when planning your weekend and take this as another opportunity for fellowship.

Non-voting members can attend the Assembly for free – bring a friend with you and expose them to service work at the Area level.

For all members not involved in general service right now, I would like to thank you for all you do in AA. Your 12 step work, sponsoring, serving on committees and round ups, making coffee or greeting at your home group – Everything you do makes a difference.

The Ninth Tradition

A.A., as such, ought never to be organized, but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.

The words "Let's keep it simple" were the last Bill W. heard from his fellow founder of A.A., shortly before Dr. Bob's death in 1950. Aware that "*if*" means our recovery program, Bill later wrote, "*We need to distinguish sharply between spiritual simplicity and functional simplicity.*" ...When we get into questions of action by groups, by areas and by A.A. as a whole, we find that we must to some extent organize to carry the message — or else face chaos. And chaos is not simplicity."

...

But in "action by groups," we find that we do need some degree of organization. If everybody thinks somebody else is going to make the coffee, what's the result? No coffee! To avoid such a disaster, one or more members agree to be responsible for preparing meeting refreshments. All the way from coffee-brewers to trustees on the General Service Board, those who take part in A.A. service work are assuming responsibility — not taking on authority. (Here, Traditions Two and Nine interlock.) Group officers are responsible to the members of the group; intergroup committees, to the groups in one locality; institutions committees, to A.A. groups in treatment facilities and correctional facilities; area committees, to all groups in their areas; Conference delegates and committees, to all groups in the U.S. and Canada; the General Service Office and Board and the board's committees, to all groups and members everywhere.

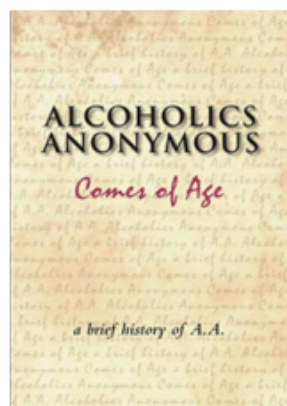

What we really mean, of course, is that A.A. can never have an organized direction or government. To amplify this: Did anyone ever hear of a nation, a church, a political party, even a benevolent association that had no membership rules? Did anyone ever hear of a society that could not somehow discipline its members and enforce obedience to necessary rules and regulations? **Does not nearly every society on earth give authority to some of its members to impose obedience upon the rest and to punish or expel offenders?** Therefore, every nation, in fact every form of society, has to be a government administered by human beings. **Power to direct and govern is the essence of organization everywhere.**

To this rule Alcoholics Anonymous is a complete exception. It does not at any point conform to the pattern of a government. Neither its General Service Conference, its General Service Board, nor the humblest group committee can issue a single directive to an A.A. member and make it stick, let alone hand out any punishment. We have tried it lots of times, but failure is always the result. Groups have tried to expel members, but the banished have come back to sit in the meeting place, saying, "This is life for us; you can't keep us out." Committees have instructed many an A.A. to stop working on a chronic backslider, only to be told: "How I do my Twelfth Step work is my business. Who are you to judge?" An A.A. may take advice or suggestions from more experienced members, but he surely will not take orders. Who is less popular than the old-time A.A., full of wisdom, who moves to another area and tries to tell the group there how to run its business? He and all like him who "view with alarm for the good of A.A." meet with stubborn resistance, or worse still, laughter.

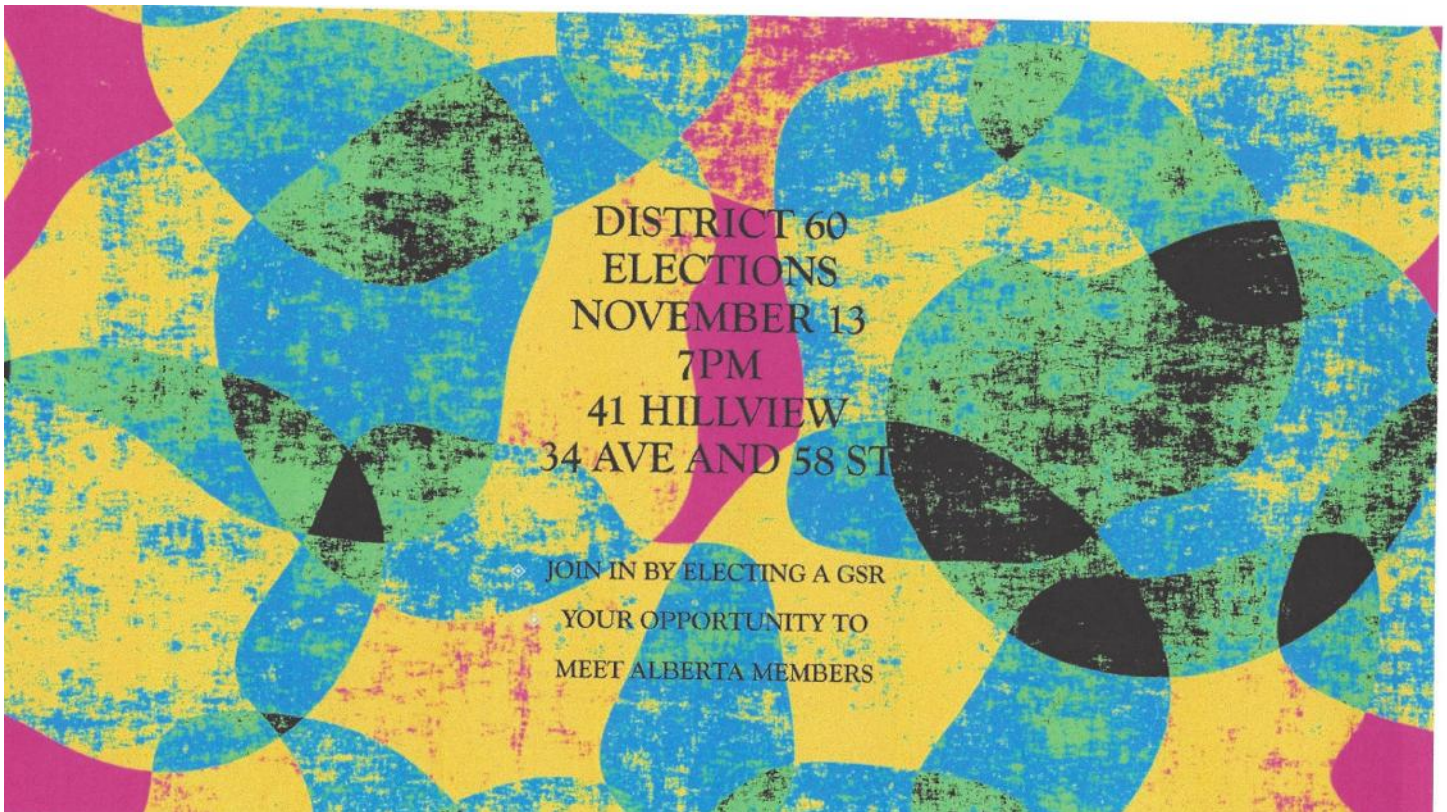
